Discussion was held on offering financial assistance to property owners for storm water repairs after City Manager, Steven Patrick updated the Council members on the recent completion of the smoke testing and the results of the testing.

City Manager, Steven Patrick stated that not many storm water issues were located on the residential properties but several issues were found on city properties and streets.

Steven Patrick stated that it would be in the city's best interest to offer financial assistance to residents to correct the storm water issues. Mr. Patrick stated that no estimates on the costs have been obtained as of yet, stating further that other cities do offer amnesty programs, and the core issue is to remove the storm water from the sanitary sewer.

Prein & Newhof are working on getting the costs of repairs to Assistant City Manager, Jonathan Seyferth.

No action was taken on the financial assistance discussion as Council requested further information on the costs of repairs.
