Department of Natural Resources still addressing the wildlife Chronic Waste Disease.

135 Million Dollars has been spent on the Bovine TB issue.

MDOT has additional funds.

Mr. Victory will be introducing House Bill 5406 which will allow for Infrastructure Tasks Forces to be formed to address critical areas of infrastructure for roads, water, sewer, etc. that will need to be repaired and/or replaced.

DEQ will be addressing the increase of tipping fees at the Coopersville Landfill.
