CITIZEN INPUT AND SUGGESTIONS

Ms. Yvonne McBride, 288 Ann St., addressed the council regarding the need for additional sidewalks on Center Street. She noted that the portions of the road north of the existing sidewalk do not have a road shoulder and creates a potentially dangerous situation. She noted that she has seen joggers, bicyclists, pedestrians, parents with strollers, and groups of students using the road on this stretch that has poor visibility due to the hill. She suggested a crossover be considered, and asked the council to please upgrade the priority for sidewalks on the capital improvement list.

Council member Cradle with second by Council member Meintsma moved to adopt the FY2013–2014 Budget and Millage Rates Draft C with an addition of \$13,400 on expenses allotted to the Fire Authority. This is per the Fire Authority’s 2013/2014 Contribution Analysis that was handed out at the meeting. The revenues approved were \$2,055,721 with general fund expenses totaling \$2,092,408. Total approved mills are 13.846248 with a 1% administration fee levied and \$123 per unit residential garbage and recycling collection fee. Motion carried. (2013–078)

Council member Fisher with second by Council member Lloyd moved to approve Van’s Contracting low bid for \$42,450 to install a 12” water service main for Select Milk Producers, Inc./Continental Dairy Facilities. Motion carried, with Council member Vander Kolk abstaining. (2013–079)

CITY MANAGER’S REPORT

City Manager Steven Patrick reported that:

- He is still at the mercy of Consumer’s Energy regarding roundabout lighting solutions and that Dennis McKee is planning to attend a public meeting to verify this!
- Steve Cooper reports that Continental Dairy is still researching their various options regarding the decibel issue for the dryers. They have discovered that some of the solutions costing upwards of \$250,000 may possibly make the noise issue *worse* may reduce decibels, but create certain tones that are even more irritating to humans.
- Fred Rosel will get quotes for crosswalk painting and will add one on Center Street.

Board members thanked Mrs. McBride for her concern and comments regarding Center Street sidewalks.
